

Introduction

We conducted a psychodiagnostic case study of U.S. president Donald Trump. The purpose of the study was to construct a Millon-based personality profile of President Trump.

Method

The assessment instrument was the 170-item Millon Inventory of Diagnostic Criteria (MIDC; Immelman, 2012), which assesses the attribute domains of expressive behavior, interpersonal conduct, cognitive style, mood/temperament, and self-image. The instrument contains 12 scales, yielding 20 normal and 14 pathological personality styles.

Personality Type

“Highly confident, dominant extravert”

- Primary patterns:** Ambitious / exploitative
Dominant / controlling
- Secondary patterns:** Outgoing / congenial
Dauntless / adventurous
