





1999 April 26: "The building known as St. Michael's Shop was demolished. Built in 1923, it was initially used as a smoke house, later as a paint shop until completion of St. Joseph's Shop in 1962, then as a flower shop. Finally it was an art studio for Sister Thomas Carey, O.S.B., and candle-making place for Sister Elaine Schindler, O.S.B. The candle shop was moved to the Monastery Artisans Studio."
